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Nearly 10,000 Former Welfare Recipients Have Found Jobs Through Manpower

Bush of the challenges and successes of the national Welfare to Work initiative. Sharon Epps of Waukegan, Ill., and Christine Anthony of Gastonia, N.C., mothers who both overcame extraordinary circumstances to leave welfare and enter the workforce, met President Bush and shared with him their welfare to work journeys. U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services Tommy G. Thompson and U.S. Secretary of Labor Elaine L. Chao also attended to support the success of the Welfare to Work mothers and the companies who employ them.

Anthony has been on assignment for Manpower for almost a year as a human resources clerk at Pathways Mental Health, Gastonia, N.C., a provider of mental health, developmental disabilities and substance abuse services.
